Rules for Paper Setting:-

All the teachers are asked to set papers of their respective subjects and the classes, then they submit these papers to the exam controller, he/she then along with the other members of the committee goes through subject papers and then mixing is done and The final paper is made. This paper is then typed in the exam room, proof read photocopied for the necessary quantity, sealed and submitted to the Principal.

Evaluation of Answer Copies:

For the terminals a teacher has to check nearly 30-35 copies in a day, whereas for Half Yearly and Annual exams 20-25 copies a day. After checking re-totaling is done by the cross-checker. After this the marks are entered in mark-slips and given to the class-teachers.

The Class teachers then takes down the marks in the result sheet maintained for each individual class. The overall results are then approved by the Principal and there after it is taken down in the report cards of the individual students.
